

# LEE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT 2004-2005 ANNUAL REPORT

## To the residents of Lee County:

I am pleased to share with you the 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the Lee County Health Department for the Fiscal Year December 1, 2004 through November 30, 2005. The health department staff continues to work diligently on a daily basis to provide a variety of services and programs to help ensure the health and safety of our communities.

Highlights from the past year include:

- A highly successful Women Out Walking (WOW) campaign. 150 women participated, with a combined total of 41,754,792 steps walked. This project was made possible through a grant from the Illinois Department of Public Health's Office of Women's Health.
- Participation in the KSB Family Medicine Residency Program—we hosted resident physician visits, so they could learn about the day to day activities of a local health department; and we have utilized the residents as a referral source for our clients.
- We again participated in the Rural Interdisciplinary Health Professions Summer Preceptorship Program in collaboration with the University of Illinois' National Center for Rural Health Professions as a host site for students in a variety of health-related fields.
- We began providing anonymous HIV testing.
- We collaborated with KSB Hospital and Sinnissippi Centers on a federal health information technology grant which was received in late 2004.
- Dr. Greg Selgestad was awarded our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Public Health Partnership Award.
- A department emergency preparedness internal steering committee was formed, which has spent a great deal of time modifying and completing our Strategic National Stockpile Medication Dispensing Plan. Additionally, the department participated in a regional distribution drill coordinated by the State of Illinois. As an addition to this plan, we have begun the initial steps of preparing for the potential of pandemic influenza.

On behalf of the Lee County Board of Health and department staff, I would like to thank the Lee County Board and the community for their support. We appreciate the opportunity to serve you.
