The health department staff works diligently on a daily basis to provide a variety of quality services to help ensure the health and safety of our communities.

## Highlights from the past year include:

- Recognition of two employees, Mary Scheffler and Janet Malmberg, for 20 years of service.
- Adoption by the Board of Health of a written policy in support of smoke-free environments in facilities of public accommodation.
- Participation once again in KSB Hospital's Family Medicine Residency Program.
- Participation once again in the Rural Interdisciplinary Health Professions Summer Preceptorship Program in collaboration with the University of Illinois' National Center for Rural Health Professions.
- Provision of two community volunteer trainings, through which nearly 50 residents were trained on our emergency medication dispensing plan.
- Completion of our first mass flu clinic/medication dispensing exercise at Sauk Valley Community College. Planning this event took countless staff hours and the assistance of many other area agencies and volunteers.
- Participation of various staff members in a variety of emergency preparedness tabletop exercises.
- Completion by various staff members of several National Incident Management System (NIMS) trainings, to ensure agency compliance at the federal level.
- Recognition of Dr. Joseph Welty as the recipient of our 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Public Health Partnership Award.
